NPS Scotland Finals Blair Atholl 2011

As we mentioned in our last newsletter, we, the Committee of NPS Scotland, were well aware of problems encountered last year many of which were regrettably out with our control.

We have received the following from the administration team at the Blair Castle International Horse Trials and Country Fair Office and hope it goes some way to explaining why such problems occurred and how they will be addressed for this years event.

"Whilst it seems like the 'off season' as the nights draw in, rest assured here at Blair we aren't sitting by the fire, feet up and a glass of Bruadar in hand, but are instead engrossed in planning next year's equestrian extravaganza.

Most readers will be aware of the stabling shortage at Blair

this August, but perhaps not aware of the reasons for it. Without wanting to make any excuses, as we hold our hands up to the fact the situation was poor this year, I do want to explain so that members understand the real reasons for the problem and don't simply rely on the rumour mill, before I outline our plans for 2012.

Our stabling is booked as early as January, meaning we have to take a best estimate as to the numbers we will need. They have to be booked by the half lorry load, in other words in increments of 48 boxes at a time. For 2011, we added the amount needed for the Young Rider Championships and then another half load to top up as we are always tight for space then the entries arrived 7 months later. A huge and unprecedented boom in international entries took everyone by surprise (throughout the season, organisers had been bemoaning poor entries at other events) and, excluding the Young Rider Championships, we had a 20% increase across the rest of the international classes.

The event simply has to take all the international entries it can – we are constantly striving to increase them and compete for 3* entries with Blenheim; full cross country days draw spectators in; and commercially we have to look at the difference in entry fees

between a showing pony and an eventer and make the decision that helps keep the event financially viable for the future.

Before letting anyone down last year, we spent a weekend on the 'phone trying to get more stables. None of the major suppliers in the UK or Ireland could help – it isn't exactly a flooded marketplace, with just a few companies – and unfortunately lack of manpower mean Auchlishie couldn't supply us with their boxes either.

Hopefully, even if it doesn't make it any less disappointing for those who were unsuccessful in applying, that sheds some light on why we had such shortages.

Looking forward to 2012, we have already booked our stables and have booked a half load (48) which will be dedicated to the Castle Field stabling area. In order to simplify the application process stables will only be offered for the week. In the event that there is still oversubscription, priority will again be given to those travelling furthest and competing most, but the closing date will be moved earlier so that applicants can be informed further in advance of the event. Hopefully we will be able to supply more than that from the total number ordered, but this means there

will be a minimum of 48 stables for the Castle Field.

There are also some other ideas in the pipeline for the future, including a new horse walk planned from the lorry park to the Bruadar Country Fair Arena, and improving the PA System to the lorry park.

I do hope that this information reassures NPS Scotland members that we are trying to find a solution to the problem that occurred this year, and generally try to listen to competitors' feedback in all respects. The NPS Scotland Finals have become established as an important element of the event, and we want to continue to improve the event for all competitors.

Wishing you the best of luck for the 2012 season, and we hope to see you at Blair for the Finals!"

Our Sponsors

Without the generosity and support from sponsorship it is becoming increasingly difficult to run and finance Shows and in particular our Championships, so in the next few newsletters we would like to give you an insight into the organisations and companies that give so generously to sponsor the Championships you all compete in.

Kilmannan Stud
(sponsor of NPS
Scotland/Kilmannan Stud
Novice Ridden Championship
and Silver Medal In-hand
Championship)

Kilmannan Stud was formed in 1992 by Mr Bill Ireland, who many of you will know well and who is a great supporter of NPS.

The Stud began when Bill purchased an unregistered Dales type gelding called Oliver who was over 20 years old. Oliver was broken to ride and drive and he was driven in Private Driving and In Hand classes for a few years and was very popular. As Oliver, although very fit, was getting old Bill decided to purchase a replacement and decided to purchase a stallion against all advice and so Slaypits Black Magic entered the scene.

He was primarily bought to drive, but soon after he arrived he was taken to the Lomondside Stud (The Misses Rennie) for an appraisal. Pat Rennie rode him around the school and stated that it was likened to sitting in an armchair. It was decided that he should be entered into Novice Ridden classes for that year. He qualified for the "Picton Novice Ridden Championship) and finished 9th at the final at Malvern. The following year the Rennies had their own New Forest pony to show so he went to Pamela Brown who brought him on to win many major shows and appeared at Olympia twice, taking the Reserve Championship on the second

occasion. After the arrival of Magic, mares were purchased and many youngsters started to arrive.

Another colt, Village Defender, purchased by Bill in 1997 qualified for Wembley for the Templeton In Hand Championship which was the beginning of an illustrious career for Defender which ended tragically in 2006 with his untimely death.

Since then Kilmannan ponies, have continued their winning ways and have played a major and winning role in all major championships including HOYS and Olympia. To name but a few, Kilmannan Black Piper, Kilmannan Black Wizard, Kilmannan Jubilee, Kilmannan Black Velvet, Slaypits Rosie and with Kilmannan Black Pearl being the "star" of 2002 taking the Reserve Overall Championship in the Simpson Refractories M&M Ridden Pony of the Year final and being the overall winner and Champion at the NPS Baileys Horse Feeds Ridden Pony of the Year at Olympia.

In 2009 Bill had a record five Kilmannan ponies present at HOYS, Kilmannan Black Magic, Kilmannan Black Velvet, Kilmannan Black Wizard, Kilmannan Kilty and Kilmannan Mischief.

In 2008 Bill achieved a lifelong ambition by adding two Suffolk Punch mares to the Kilmannan Stud, Eyke Thistle who arrived in foal and with a filly foal at foot, Eyke Diamond and Easton Spring, also in foal.

The foals duly arrived, both colts, namely Kilmannan Smart and Kilmannan Short and another mare was purchased Colony Tarragon. Last year Thistle had a colt foal which unfortunately died soon after birth and Spring had a filly.

An NPS Scotland visit is planned to Kilmannan this year, as mentioned, earlier, please watch for further details.

Kilgraston School
(sponsor of NPS

The leading Perthshire boarding school, Kilgraston, has recently received the accolade of Independent School of the Year!

The boarding and day school for girls in Bridge of Earn received the prestigious award at the Independent School Awards, sponsored by The Spectator magazine and VISA, held at the National Motorcycle Museum last month. The award is a reflection of the hard work of all the staff and pupils over the last few years and the transformation of Kilgraston into Scotland's leading girls' boarding school. The judges took into account Kilgraston's recent excellent HMIe inspection along with a number of factors including its recent outstanding examination results. The judges described Kilgraston as "particularly impressive", "forward thinking" and "an example to other schools".

Kilgraston pupils have achieved their best results ever this year, with an exceptional 57% passes at A grade (95% A-C) for Higher and an outstanding 54% A grade passes (92% A-C) at Advanced Higher. The Standard Grade results were also excellent with 88% Credit (Grade 1-2). These results are among the best in Scotland and a testament to the hard work of the girls and staff.

Following on from a recent multi-million pound investment in sport and the arts, Kilgraston is about to start a new wave of capital investment. A new Science Building will commence construction in the spring to create a better space for scientific study and once complete, the old laboratories will be incorporated into an enhanced Sixth Form Centre with state of the art facilities. This will be an area dedicated to Sixth Form with individual study areas, exclusive computer access and state of the art classrooms to provide the best learning environment at this pivotal moment in the pupils' academic careers.

Kilgraston is Scotland's largest girls' boarding school and is set in 54 acres of beautiful parkland in Bridge of Earn, just south of Perth. With an Equestrian Centre featuring a 60 m x 40 m floodlit arena (Kilgraston is the only school in Scotland with this facility on site), an International sized all-weather hockey pitch, 8 all-weather tennis courts, sports hall with climbing wall and fitness suite and a 25 m indoor swimming pool there is enough to keep the girls occupied!

Scholarship day takes place on Saturday 4th February 2012. Academic, Art, Music and Sports Scholarships are available for pupils for entry to U3rd (P7) through to U6th (S6).
